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# History Of Socks Timeline

Imagine it or not socks have been round for the reason that stone ages. They had been very totally different from socks as we all know them today. They were typically manufactured from animal skins that had been tied around the ankles.

In Ancient Egypt there's proof of the existence of knitted socks and by the eighth century BC, the Greek poet Hesiod wrote of paloi - socks product of matted animal hair. They were largely worn by actors in comedic plays.

Through the Center Ages colored fabric tied around the legs and held up with garters have been in popular use. Garters had been placed excessive of the sock/stocking to prevent them from falling down. They were principally worn among the more wealthy.

In the 1490's, breeches and hosiery were one piece. They later grew to become often called tights. They were made of colourful silks, wools and velvet. Every leg was typically a different color. On the flip of the fifteenth century knitted hose was being worn in France and Scotland.

In the 1590's knitting machines had been created. This made using knitted hose extra common. With the sporting of tunics hose had to be made longer.

In the 17th century the usage of cotton turned popular in the making of socks. Early Americans additionally used wool and silk. Poorer individuals wore woolen hose normally tan in color. The rich alternatively wore effective silk hosiery and more colors.

In the course of the 19th century knitting mills allowed hose to be made in America. As males's pants became longer stockings grew to become shorter till the time period was changed to sock and replaced the time period stocking. The word sock is derived from the Latin phrase "soccus" which suggests mild overlaying of the foot. Women to this point wear stockings, tights, or socks.

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
