These include: cavalier boots, altair boots, castle top leather boots, high boots with fringes, King Henry boots, Locksley boots, low boots with fringe, low boots without fringe, leather calf boots, musketeer boots, phantom boots, viking boots, captains boots, dragoon boots, high seas boots, swashbuckler boots, Dartagnon boots, and even villager boots. In order to keep this article short, we will only cover a few of these.

The first type of boots we will discuss are cavalier boots. These boots extended all the way up to the knees and had large fold over cuffs at the top. Youll find that the cuffs were turned inside just as much as they were turned outside.

Next are the Altair [medieval boots](#). Providing protection to the wearers shins, the Altair boot went all the way up to the bottom of the knees. This boot had 2 distinct parts and could be changed depending on your needs.

Following this we had the castle top leather boots. Crenellation edges at the top of these boots give them their name and distinct look. Extending all the way up to the knee these boots provide great shin protection. The Showtime series show The Tudors showcases these boots on the character Henry.

High boots with fringes are very common medieval boots. The moccasin style design is made up of a suede material. The boot extends up to the knees and folds down to the outside. Laces move from the bottom of the boot all the way up to the top.

Measuring at a height of twenty five inches, the King Henry boots are some of the tallest medieval boots around. They are made from a combination of suede and leather and provide protection for most of the leg.
