# Washing Your Hawaiian Jewelry

Dirt is also vulnerable to built up inside the carvings of the actual designs. Over time the actual gold will seem to lose its shine and can require cleaning.

A mild answer of liquid plate detergent and warm water enables you to clean your platinum Hawaiian jewelry. Soak each piece for 15 minutes, then proceed to utilize brush away any dirt utilizing a soft toothbrush. As gold damaged easily, be sure to never scrub too hard. Once the buildup have been removed, rince in warm running water, and blot dry with a soft polishing cloth.

Once your jewellery is cleaned, and if it's not being worn, keep it inside a fabric-lined jewelry situation. If you choose to use ordinary packing containers, wrap each part individually in gentle tissue paper. This will assist with resist reaction with moisture inside the air.
